

Safety and Personal Freedom

As you get older you get more personal freedom, this means that you are responsible for your own safety and recognizing unsafe situations. There may be times when there is not an adult around to report to or get help from. There may also be times that you are not only responsible for your own safety but the safety of others, such as younger brothers or sisters.

Being on your own can be a lot of fun, but when no adults are around you are in charge of your own safety. What are some situations that could be unsafe when you're alone or just with friends?

With the freedom that we get as we get older we also have our personal power, our personal power gives us the tools to help us make safe decisions that help ourselves and others





Types of Bullying and Harassment

• What is Bullying? What is harassment?

Harassment

- Unwanted comments, gestures, or actions that make a person feel unsafe.

• Bullying:

- Is similar to harassment but has three key features: It is repeated, there is intent to harm, and a power imbalance exists between the people involved.

Most students in this school like to put others down 42% disagree






Consent Activity

• There are laws around consent, it is not okay to assume someone is consenting, it is not okay for people to abuse their power, consent should be ongoing and open discussion, respecting boundaries.




